

H97



The State Board of Education shall modify the State curriculum requirements to include one required credit in arts education to be completed by each student prior to high school graduation at any time in grades 6-12.



H97 Is...

- Simple—no fiscal impact
- Flexible—one arts education credit anytime in grades 6-12
- Diverse—visual, music, dance, theatre, design; in-school, out-of-school, virtual
- Accessible—opportunities for all students regardless of where they live
- Supported—bi-partisan House vote of 110-8.

- Levels the playing field between rural and metropolitan districts.
